
UN GGIM: Setting the global agenda for geospatial development

- The SDGs are highly dependent on the understanding of geographic location, necessitating the inclusion and use of geospatial information, Earth observations and other forms of location-based data.
- The SDGs are highly dependent on geospatial information and Earth observations (EO) as the primary data for relating people to their location and place, and to measure 'where' progress is, or is not being made, particularly at 'disaggregated' sub-national and local levels



The SDG Geospatial Roadmap

The SDGs Geospatial Roadmap is a living resource that helps communicate, guide and enhance the awareness of geospatial information, Earth Observations, and related data sources, tools and methods, to inform and support the implementation, measurement and monitoring of the SDGs, according to national circumstances.



It will assist countries in bridging the geospatial digital divide, secure socio-economic prosperity, and to leave no one behind.






Framework for Effective Land Administration




